Venues

Mariehamn

Mariehamn (population 11,000) is the capital and only town of the Åland Islands. Åland is an autonomous province of the Republic of Finland - an archipelago of 6,500 islands in the Baltic Sea. The town was founded in 1861 by the Czar of Russia. Its main industry is shipping. Its location makes for excellent communications with the mainlands of Finland, Estonia, and Sweden, as well as the islands in all three countries, see map below!

The Åland University of Applied Sciences has trained professionals in the trades of the sea since 1856. The student body is about 500 with a staff of around 50. Read more at www.ha.ax/en

- Conference article (paper): 30 minutes
- Workshop: 90 minutes
- My practice: 20 minutes, a short, practical session to demonstrate or describe a specific approach, resource or solution that you use in your teaching. The aim of this session is to: present your practical experience; show materials; provide creative ideas; or explain how you work on a particular topic.
- Round table: 40 minutes, a moderated academic discussion based on a previously agreed topic of relevance for the conference. The moderator will have prepared a set of questions to be discussed by the participants.

Accommodation

We have special deals with a few good hotels in Mariehamn for the nights of Sept 30 - Oct 3 (3 nights). **Don't book yourself. We'll get a better price!** They are all within walking distance from the conference venue and the town centre, see <u>Google Maps</u>.

Arkipelag € 100/room (double) incl breakfast and evening sauna/pool. The 35 first rooms booked are with seaview. Nightclub, lobby bar, and restaurant. Nextdoor to the conference venue, Alandica

The first night (September 29) is in Turku. The next three nights are in Mariehamn and then you need to DECIDE if you go to Sweden or back to Finland (see the map below). Getting to Finland

It is most convenient to fly to Helsinki Airport. Its location in North-eastern Europe makes it perfect for connections with Asia!

From Helsinki International Airport there are buses and trains both into the centre of Helsinki AND directly to Turku. In addition it is possible to fly to Turku.

The bus or train trip between Helsinki and Turku takes about 2 hours and is inexpensive.




Stockholm



Getting to the Aland Islands

The Islands are served by several ferry companies with some 30 arrivals daily. There are three ports of departure in Sweden, four in Finland and one in Estonia. In addition there are daily flights from Helsinki, Turku and Stockholm. Since the conference starts on a ferry **we recommend that you travel to Turku** (normally via Helsinki).
